\$ ☑ **Secret Garden Iguazú.** Dense tropical vegetation overhangs the wooden walkway that leads to this tiny guesthouse's three rooms, tucked away in a pale-blue clapboard house. There's nothing fancy about them, but the wood and wicker furniture and brightly painted paneling are cheerful and welcoming. So is the owner, John Fernandes.
